

Presbyterian College Campus Participant Agreement

ALL PARTICIPANTS

Participants of the SCBA 2023 Summer Conference are guests of Presbyterian College and are required to abide by the following regulations:

Participants are to wear and make their conference identification lanyard visible at all times. Those without proper identification may be asked to leave by campus security.

All youth are to be accompanied by a parent and are to be supervised at all times.

Shirt, shoes, and appropriate attire are expected in the dining hall, classrooms, and auditorium.

Participants are expected to abide by Presbyterian College traffic rules. Parking is allowed only in designated lots. Parking on campus streets is prohibited unless otherwise designated.

Presbyterian College prohibits:

- The possession or use of alcoholic beverages on College property with this exception: Proper arrangements have been made to provide a Cash Bar in the Spring Student Center Wednesday and Thursday evening, and during the Friday evening Beek Bash BBQ.
- The possession and use of tobacco products including vaping.
- The unlawful possession and/or unlawful use of drugs.
- Tampering with fire alarms, extinguishers, or other fire safety equipment. If acts of this nature occur, the College may impose a fine of up to \$500.00.
- Disorderly conduct that unnecessarily infringes upon the rights, privacy and health/safety of others or is dangerous to property.
- Firearms, weapons, ammunitions, fireworks, open flames, explosives or highly flammable materials on or in college property.
- Entry into the College fountain or pond located on campus.
- Vandalism of any kind.

Individuals who fail to abide by these provisions may also be forced to leave campus immediately at the discretion of College Staff; participants who leave will be required to do so at their own cost, and their removal will not result in a refund by SCBA. The institution also reserves the right to fine the group up to \$250 for non-compliance for each infraction.

HOUSING PARTICIPANTS

On-campus housing is offered as an affordable option to the attendee's of the SC Beekeepers Association Summer Conference. Participants selecting to stay in campus housing are required to abide by the following regulations.

Arrival

Friday, July 28 between 4-6pm in Edmunds Hall Lobby

Departure

Prepare for check out by following these steps:

- Remove all belongings from the residence hall rooms no later than noon.
- Remove all trash from the room and place it in the dumpsters located outside of each residence hall.
- Leave all residence hall room doors open and unlocked.
- Turn in building access and room keys to SCBA staff as designated. PC charges \$150 for lost keys and access cards. Please keep them secure!
- Report any noticeable damages to SCBA staff upon check out.

Presbyterian College prohibits:

- Bicycles, animals, skateboards / scooters, wrestling, and playing sports in any part of the residence halls.
- Smoking / vaping / tobacco use on College property
- Any form of cooking appliance in any of the rooms.
- Tampering with electrical or mechanical fixtures in the rooms.
- Placement of antennas or satellite dishes for radios, stereos, TVs, etc., in or outside of the window.
- Removal or addition of furniture to any rooms and common rooms or altering the premises in any manner whatsoever without the prior permission of the Office of Residence Life.
- Attaching any object to doors, walls or windows by nail, screw or tape.
- Use of glitter, glue, paint, paint pens, or spray paint.
- Tampering with or removal of windows or window screens from any part of the buildings.
- Unlocking or propping exterior or other doors that should remain locked during specific time periods.

- Pets on campus at any time.
- Going onto the roof or ledge of any campus building.
- Participating in water fights or activities not part of the program's agenda.

Individuals who fail to abide by these provisions may also be forced to leave campus immediately at the discretion of College Staff; individuals who leave will be required to do so at their own cost, and their removal will not result in a refund for the sponsoring group. The institution also reserves the right to fine the group up to \$250 for noncompliance in addition to damages incurred by prohibited actions or objects.

Participants are required to take the appropriate steps to ensure that rooms are secure so that theft or vandalism does not occur. The College does not insure against loss or theft of personal items nor assume an obligation to pay for the loss or damage to the personal property of groups or individual participants occurring in its buildings or on its grounds.

The College may enter, inspect, or search a participant's room under the following conditions:
(a) when there is a reasonable suspicion that an occupant may be physically harmed or endangered, (b) when there is a reasonable suspicion that College regulations or State/Federal laws are being violated, (c) periodic health and safety inspection of the residence hall rooms, or (d) when a work order is requested for maintenance or housekeeping.
